The Town Administrator called the meeting to order.

**SWEARING IN. Board of Selectmen.** Robin Michaud, Town Clerk, swore in the newly elected Selectmen. This is the 370<sup>th</sup> Board of Selectmen for the Town of Marblehead.

**CHAIRMAN.** Motion made and seconded to nominate Jackie Belf-Becker as Chair for the coming year. Moved by Mr. Nye, seconded by Mrs. Jacobi. On a polled vote the Board voted as follows: Mr. Grader, in favor; Mrrs. Jacobi, in favor; Mr Nye, in favor, Mr. Depew, in favor, Mrs. Belf-Becker, in favor.

**DISCLOSURE – Chapter 268A.** Judith R. Jacobi and Jackie Belf-Becker each read disclosures required under Chapter 268A Section 23(B) (3) of the Mass General Laws, which have been filed with the Town Clerk.

The Chair welcomed David Depew to the Board of Selectmen.

**OUTDOOR SEATING.** The following applications were reviewed by the Board for outdoor seating:

**The Little Store, 9 Green Street.** Matthew Gateman appeared before the Board seeking permission for outdoor seating and to have his Carry-In Beverage License approved outside as well. After review, motion made and seconded, Pursuant to Executive Order COVID-19, No. 35, issued by Governor Baker on June 1, 2020, and notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 40A of the General Laws, or any special permit, variance or other approvals thereunder, or any general or special law to the contrary, the Board of Selectmen for the Town of Marblehead approves the application for outdoor seating submitted by Matthew Gateman, The Little Store, 9 Green Street, provided that the

operation remains in substantial compliance with the documents, plans and statements contained within said application and submitted therewith, which documents are incorporated herein by reference. This approval is freely revocable upon the determination of the Health Department, Chief of Police, Board of Health, or their designees that the operation of the outdoor dining area is negatively impacting public health and safety. Further, this approval shall automatically be rescinded on November 1, 2020 or upon the rescission of Executive Order COVID-19, No. 35, whichever shall come first and is subject to final approval by the Town Administrator, Police and Fire. This approval is freely revocable upon the determination of the Health Department., Chief of Police, Board of Health, or their designees that the operation of the outdoor dining area is negatively impacting public health and safety. Further, this approval shall automatically be rescinded on November 1, 2020 or upon the rescission of Executive Order COVID-19, No. 35, whichever shall come first and is subject to final approval by the Town Administrator, Police and Fire. This approval is freely revocable upon the determination of the Health Department, Chief of Police, Board of Health, or their designees that the operation of the outdoor dining area is negatively impacting public health and safety. Further, this approval shall automatically be rescinded on November 1, 2020 or upon the rescission of Executive Order COVID-19, No. 35, whichever shall come first and is subject to final approval by the Town Administrator, Police and Fire and the

This approval is freely revocable upon the determination of the Health Department, Chief of Police, Board of Health, or their designees that the operation of the outdoor dining area is negatively impacting public health and safety. Further, this approval shall automatically be rescinded on November 1, 2020 or upon the rescission of Executive Order COVID-19, No. 35, whichever shall come first and is subject to final approval by the Town Administrator, Police and Fire.
