Recreation and Parks Meeting Minutes 11/05/2014

NOTE: The following is a summary of matters submitted at a meeting of the Recreation and Parks Commission in accordance with M.G.L Chapter 39 and the Massachusetts Open Meeting Laws. Meetings are often recorded and tapes used as an aid.

Call to order: Chip called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM.

2) Attendance:

- a) Present (constituting a quorum): Chip, Linda, Jerry, and Derek (7:40 PM).
- b) Absent: Sam.
- 3) Minutes of last meeting: Motion made and seconded to approve the minutes of all past regularly scheduled meetings; all in favor.
- 4) Appearance: Don Morgan and Bob French from the Conservancy Committee appeared to discuss idea (see attached) of donating money to the department to hire a dedicated seasonal staff person to help keep up the 5 miles of trails the trail committee oversees. Discussion included: in place donation fund, seasonal salary of @ \$540 a week, management & supervision, accountability, punch lists, qualifications, equipment, transportation, 1 full timer vs. 2 part timers, and Senior and Eagle Scout projects, Don and Bob will begin working on funding and punch lists.

5) Reports (attached). Addendum:

a) Travis:

- Marketing: Discussion included funding for doing Town wide mailing of brochures; Revolving fund balance; and on line registration. After discussion, Motion made and seconded to allow Travis to purchase two 3 month advertising trials with "Wicked Local.com" and doing 3 Town wide mailings of the Winter/Spring, Summer, and Fall program brochures with costs to be paid from the Revolving fund; all in favor.
- ii) PTO: Travis was approached by the PTO regarding marketing programs; Board agreed Travis should look into it.
- iii) School scheduling: Facility scheduling is still an issue with the schools.
- iv) SUP programs: Travis distributed a list of programs he'd like to see at Riverhead (attached) for the Board's consideration. Discussion of creating RFP.

b) Tim:

- Advertising: Board agreed that the stickers with warnings shouldn't go on playground structures as they also have advertising on them; will consider alternatives.
- Storm damage: New shed at Gatchells has roof damage. Derek is going to reach out to Youth Baseball to see about repairs. Tim is getting quotes on repairs to bathroom building.
- iii) Community Garden: Conservation is delaying work on the garden until Tim & Willie walk the property.

6) Old Business:

- b) Derek: Gatchells' Lights: Board asked Tim to get the instillation scheduled.

7) New Business:

- a) Chip: Memorial Park:
 - i) Fence line: Chip asked Tim have Pete do the measurements to get the brickwork installed.
 - ii) Daffodils: New bulbs have been ordered and will be planted next week to replace the ones that died out.
 - iii) <u>Pedestrian lights:</u> MMLD has received the lights. Tim is coordinating with them regarding installation; hopefully before the Christmas walk.

b) Chip: Budget:

- i) Beach Playground: bills come out of Revolving fund beach money.
- ii) Parking Islands: tabled until next budget season.
- iii) Grounds keeping tools & supplies: In pretty good shape, have grass seed and fertilizer in inventory. Chip got the following quotes to Turf blanket fields: Gatchells major infield: \$1100; Seaside infield \$1500; and Hopkins \$10,000 to cover completely, which the Board agreed is too much. Discussion of putting in water on Lower MHS, and getting a \$10,000 waterwheel machine to do Lower MHS and Seaside outfield.
- c) Correspondence (attached):
 - i) Recycling committee e-mail: Chip informed the Board of the message and the Board agreed that: the department has no manpower, recycling trucks, bins, or money to fund the program; it's the responsibility of the Health Department to run a recycling program, not the Park & Recreation Department; and Chip will respond to the message.
 - ii) Mass Audubon: Motion made and seconded to approve; all in favor.
- 8) <u>Timekeeping</u>: Meeting Adjourned: 9:10 PM. Next meeting scheduled for Tuesday November 18, 2014. **Motion** made and seconded to return to 7:00 PM start time; all in favor.

Chip & Tim, at our Marblehead Conservancy Trails Committee meeting last night we discussed our continuing inability to do all the projects we want to do. We send out Trail Crews twice a week, every week, all year long usually consisting of 3-6 people. We average well over 1,000 man hours every year.

One of the ideas we discussed was an arrangement with you (Rec & Park). Our initial thought is that we would fund a seasonal worker (June-August?) for your department who would work on our projects. However, it might be more flexible than that - you could deploy our worker with yours, just so we get the total hours we paid for. The projects we that might be most suitable for this kind of arrangement would be some of our routine maintenance tasks like trimming weeds & brush from the sides of trails, mowing some small meadows and spreading wood chips. We can train people for these tasks fairly easily. We can provide most if not all tools & equipment; although you may have some more productive ones or more of them (e.g. we only have one Stihl string trimmer).

If you are interested, we would like to meet with you to flush this out a little more.

One of the issues is supervision on the job. We can't provide it, although we can provide trailing and site maps about where to do the work.

This will all take place in town owned properties and we assume town insurance would cover your workers.

Do your workers log hours on projects?

What would a worker cost? What overhead costs would be included?
