Recreation and Parks Meeting Minutes

07-02-12

I have received a letter of complaint (see attached) from Mr. Doug Church regarding the handling of a recent boat storage issue down at Devereux Beach. Upon receipt of the letter I asked Brendan Egan to provide me with a summary of his actions as they relate to this incident (also attached for your review).

I reviewed the matter with Brendan and then called Mr. Church on Wednesday, June 20th, to discuss. I explained to Mr. Church that it was my opinion that the matter was handled appropriately by Brendan and that the towing of the boat was a logical conclusion to the sequence of events. I further explained that I find no reason to offer reimbursement for the towing expense especially in light of the patience exercised by Mr. Egan over what appears to be a 5 month period of time.

Mr. Church was not satisfied with this answer and I then explained to him that I would be glad to forward this to the Marblehead Parks and Recreation Commission as they would be his final recourse. He indicated that he would prefer that I do so. Therefore, please accept this package of information as a summary of the complaint and the resulting actions by my office. If you should have any questions or would like me to attend a meeting to discuss, I will make myself available as appropriate.

That I went to see on tuisday 5/29/12 that everybody was notified that Had A traler or Bout to got It out of there By 10 Am Sunday, which I never west If I was told to move I would Have moved to Riverhead till noon, when I went Over there to pick the Boot up to SellIt's There Where boots At Riverhead that where behind the Shed. I was not told In Anyway to move my bart not by Brenchin or by the Police Departments Now Im out \$3000 Dollars for my bout and \$217 for the tow which I know the town Should Pay for the tow. I was not nothered In Any Shape of form to move my Boat from the Beach. All I Had to do was been be not feel, It would there taken 5 minutes to loring It to Riverhead. I know I'm Intitled to the 217 for the tow, for those Reasons

December 6, 2011

 Boat Storage behind Devereux Beach garage approved by Recreation and Parks Commission pending approval of agreement by Town

December 20, 2011

- Devereux Beach added to Marina Liability Insurance endorsement
- Winter boat / lobster trap agreements approved
- Receive first signed agreements
- Attempts made to reach Doug Church, owner of boat that has been left behind Devereux garage for last year

January 2012

Contact is made with Mr Church

February 17, 2012

- Mr. Church submits Winter Storage Application / Agreement
- Mr. Church states that he is out of work and does not get regular pay checks;
 asks if he can submit payment in two weeks when he gets paid next and I agree
- Payment never received

March 2012

- Contacted Mr. Church regarding payment for boat storage and states he is trying to sell boat
- Mr. Church cannot come up with fee and I agree to allow him to keep the boat at the beach as long as the boat is out by May 15 deadline

May 11, 2012

- Reminder letter to boat and lobster trap storage people that items must be out by May 15, 2012

May 17, 2012 ?-

While at the beach I run into Mr. Church cleaning his boat behind beach garage. He told me he was selling it and needed to find someone to tow his boat out from behind the garage because his truck was not big enough. I agreed to give him some extra time to get it moved.

May 21, 2012

- Ran into Mr. Church at the beach and he informed me the boat trailer had a flat tire and he was trying to get money to fix it.

May 23, 2012-

While at beach I saw Mr. Church and he informed me the tire was getting fixed and he was going to be removing the boat

May 25, 2012

While at beach with Recreation Supervisor and, Jim Sullivan, I witnessed Mr. Church fixing the flat on his trailer. He told me the boat was going to be out that night or by Saturday (May 26) at the latest.

May 26, 2012

- While at the beach meeting with Lime Rickey's owner, Paul Petersiel about the lack of parking I notice approximately 6 boat trailers, 2 with boats on them, parked perpendicular across parking spots

I took MS numbers and plate numbers and asked the Police dispatchers if they could track down the owners and ask them to remove their boats/trailers. If they were not removed by Sunday, May 27 at 11:00 a.m. they would be towed.

- Mr. Church's boat was in the parking lot at this time. I did not contact him because he told me on Friday, the boat would be out that night or Saturday at the latest.

May 27, 2012

Boats / trailers still in the lot at 9:00 a.m. I called dispatch and asked them to continue with towing the boats/trailers at 11:00 a.m. if they were still there.

June 11, 2012

 Mr. Church's boat appears in the lower parking lot of Gerry Playground (Stramski's)

Recreation Commission Meeting July 2, 2012 Superintendent's Report

Parks / Fields

The tennis courts at Seaside Park have been completed and will be opened on July 4 for a "free" day of tennis. I have been working on a plan to do the fencing and will have a total cost at a future meeting.

Devereux Beach

I am having three new "Rules & Regulations" signs made to replace the current signs. The wording on the signs has begun to melt.

I would like to purchase a York rake for the removal of seaweed at the beach. The cost of the rake is \$1,499 and I would be purchasing it out of the revolving account (beach parking).

Memorial Park / Shattuck Request

We have been awarded a grant in the amount of \$40,000 for Phase II of the Memorial Park project. I will be seeking bids in August for work to be done in the fall (see attached).

Lead Mills

The town meeting article of the acquisition of the lead mills property authorized the recreation and Park commission to sign the application on behalf of the town. This is required by the grant even though it is held by the conservation commission.

I would like to ask the commission to vote to submit a PARC grant application on behalf of the town of Marblehead, which is a joint application with the City of Salem, for the acquisition of the lead mills site in the amount of \$400,000 and to authorize the chairman to sign on behalf of the board.

Fort Sewall

The bathroom building at Fort Sewall was painted, the roof was power-washed of moss and some shingles were replaced last week. I would like to ask the commission to vote to approve the expenditure of \$1,600 from the Curtis Coffin fund to cover the cost of paint and repairs.



We are formally proposing the idea of a non-profit summer outdoor music festival. We will have local high school and college-age musicians from around the Commonwealth perform. Our primary objective is to donate any funds procured from this music festival to organizations including the Marblehead Cares Coalition and the Plummer Home in Salem. Also, funds will be collected via donations from those who wish to attend and donate to the music festival. We want to promote local businesses that have cart and vending licenses by asking them to support our cause by catering our festival. This music festival is meant to attract people of all age groups, including people from other towns. Moreover, this music festival is designed to promote a safe and family friendly environment. It is also our intent to unite the community of Marblehead. Our target audience is primarily students and families, however this does not exclude anyone who wishes to attend.

The student committee organizing this event consists of Victoria Polunina, Geoff Selden, Dylan Woodrow, Leo Chalvin and Tyler Foley. Ideally this music festival will be held at Crocker Park on July 28th starting with set up at 8:00 a.m. with the beginning of the actual festival at 12:00 p.m. and running until 8:00 p.m. with clean up until 9:30 p.m. We will be asking Terry's Ice Cream, and either Romano's or Tony's pizza to help cater the event providing they have cart and vending licenses. We already have a growing list of bands that are willing to perform at this festival. We will obtain stage and tent rentals, as well as a police detail to fill the requirement of security. In the event of inclement weather, we are currently arranging a rain location.

We are asking Marblehead Parks and Recreation to help us co-sponsor this festival. We are also requesting that Marblehead Parks and Recreation cover the expenses of the permit, the expenses of the insurance and the expenses of the electric bill. This will be enormously helpful to the success of our endeavors, and will not only be beneficial to the festival itself, but also to the Town of Marblehead because it will enhance the quality of this festival. Also this will enable us to use the donated funds from the audience to support Marblehead Cares and the Plummer Home. We have already contacted Department of Health and in the event that vendors need to be supplied hand-washing machines, we ask that the Board of Park and Recreation cover the cost of the rentals. In the case of bad weather, we request that the Marblehead Board of Park and Recreation allows us to use it's gymnasium.
